Dive Master IDEC covers dives to 50m on air and 80m unsupported / 130m supported on trimix (subject to diving qualifications). Do not dive within 24 hours of your return flight. Divers over the age of 70 must provide a valid (current and dated within the last year and to cover the whole period of travel) annual fitness to dive medical certificate signed by a Diving Doctor who must be a member of the UK Sport Diving Medical Committee or HSE approved Diving Doctor.

Medical Details - Important Information, please read:

Divemaster ask we confirm a few details with our guests prior to booking a policy. Please find below three questions we need to confirm with you prior to taking out the policy:

All IDEC applicants must be able to answer No to all of the following questions:

1. Have you previously suffered from any diving accident or injury?
2. Are you suffering from any condition which may render you as unfit to dive?
3. Are you currently taking any medication or receiving any medical treatment?

If a member of your party answers Yes to question 3 but is only taking medication that is bought 'over the counter' or their prescribed medication is only for Cholesterol, Thyroxin for Thyroid Conditions, HRT, Acid Reflux or contraception then this is acceptable.

All guests who are taking other prescribed medication must provide Regaldiver with the following details:

1. Name of Guest applying for Divemaster Insurance
2. A brief summary of your medication and medical condition.

Please also include with your application your valid "fit to dive" certificate. Regaldiver will then go to Divemaster for a final decision on coverage for you and confirm by return.
