

## Nuweiba Excursions

Regaldive are able to offer a number of excursions and trips which you can book whilst in resort. Below, we have provided brief details of the most popular excursions you can book from Nuweiba.

**Name:** Moses Mountain & St. Catherine's Monastery **Duration:** Full day

**Price:** £40 adult & £22 children

An early morning start takes you to the foot of the 2285m high Moses Mountain where you begin the climb. Guests who wish can hire a camel for the climb. The last part of the climb to the top involves 775 steps. It is here where it is believed Moses received his ten commandments. Upon reaching the top of the mountain, you will see the most amazing sunrise which is truly breath taking.

After the trek down from the mountain, you are welcomed into St. Catherine's Monastery, which is at a height of 1750m. The monastery is surrounded by a wall of red granite, which is nearly a metre in height. St. Catherine's is the oldest functioning monastery in the world and visitors also get to see the burning bush, where it is said God appeared to Moses.



**Name:** Petra

**Duration:** Full day

**Price:** £239 adult & £139 children

After a 75 minute ferry boat journey across to Aqaba in Jordan, you will travel by horseback (included in the cost) or chariot (extra charge payable) through the desert and then through the amazing canyon. The size of the canyon, together with the rich colours will astound you.

Upon arrival at the site, you will be guided through the city that is carved into the rock which is 80m high in places. You will see the Treasury, Royal Tombs, Court, Roman Theatre, Roman Street, Pharaoh's Daughter's Palace and other monuments. Petra is classed as one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. After lunch, visitors will drive back to Aqaba, where there is some free time to explore the coastal resort, before catching the ferry boat back to Nuweiba.



**Name:** Star Watching & Camel Trek    **Duration:** PM    **Price:** £45 adult & £23 children

This excursion takes you away from the town of Dahab, into the peaceful desert. Upon arrival at the point in the desert, you will get to experience the Bedouins local form of transport, the Camel. A camel ride takes you through the desert to the Bedouin village, where you are greeted with a cup of tea! This is a great opportunity to see and learn how the Bedouins live in the barren desert before a traditional Bedouin dinner is served.

After watching the incredible sunset, an astrologist will point the amazing planets and stars out and you will have the opportunity to observe these through the huge digital telescopes. As there is very little light pollution in the desert it is an amazing experience to look at the night sky.
