

LEMBEH STRAIT



World famous for its macro life, this is arguably the finest destination in the world for macro enthusiasts. Lembeh plays host to a cornucopia of weird and wonderful creatures that are found here and here alone. Diving is over shallow black sandy slopes where seahorses and nudibranchs are found in abundance. Many of the species that are encountered are simply not found elsewhere. Inimicus devilfish, dwarf lionfish, scorpion fish, puffer fish, mimic octopus, pegasus sea moths, frogfish, ribbon eels and flying gurnards to name but a few.

Lembeh's dive sites provide keen photographers with a source of endless macro subjects. This is 'critter diving' at its very best! For divers looking for an alternative to Lembeh's macro life, the straits are also the finally resting place for a number of WWII shipwrecks, most of which are in diveable range.
